Dear Sir/Madam,

This letter is to confirm that the French Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs supports the application for ".corsica" submitted to ICANN in the New gTLD Program.

The gTLD ".corsica" will be used to allow websites about or otherwise dedicated to the French administrative region of Corsica to benefit from this new TLD and is designed to supplement the current array of domain suffixes.

The French Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs supports this application and, in doing so, understands that in the event that the application is successful, the applicant for ".corsica" will be required to enter into a Registry Agreement with ICANN. In doing so, the applicant will be required to pay fees to ICANN and comply with consensus policies developed through the ICANN multi-stakeholder policy process.

The French Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs further understands that, in the event of a dispute between the French Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs and the applicant, ICANN will comply with a legally binding order from a court in the French jurisdiction.

The French Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs understands that the Geographic Names Panel engaged by ICANN will, among other things, conduct due diligence on the authenticity of this documentation.
